


Early voting for the 2022 General Election available now at Town Hall

Election Day is Tuesday, November 8. Early voting for the 2022 General Election begins Wednesday, October 12 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Community Room at Schererville Town Hall, 10 East Joliet St., and will continue through Monday, November 7.

Hours are 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays in October. Voters can cast their ballots from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Thursdays in October, and from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, October 28.

During the first week of November, the polls will be open from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Tuesday. Wednesday. Friday and Saturday. On Monday, the day before the General Election, early voting will be available from 9 a.m. until noon.

According to public law, Indiana residents are required to present a government-issued ID before

casting their ballots. That ID needs to meet certain criteria:

- Must display your photo
- Must include your name as it conforms to your voter registration record
- Must display an expiration date
- Must be issued by the State of Indiana or the U.S. government.

In most cases, an Indiana driver's license, Indiana photo ID card. Military ID or U.S. Passport is sufficient. A student ID from an Indiana State school may only be used if it meets all four criteria specified above.

The wearing of face masks inside Schererville Town Hall is optional.

Leaf pickup begins week of October 3

Autumn brings falling leaves, and this year the Public Works Department will begin leaf pickup on the south side of U.S. 30 the week of October 3. Leaf pickup begins on the north side of U.S. 30 the week of October 10. Branch pickup also continues through December with both pickups dependent upon weather.

No pickups are scheduled on holidays, including Election Day, Tuesday, November 8; Veteran's Day, Friday, November 11; Thanksgiving, Thursday and Friday, November 24 and 25; Christmas, Friday, December 23 and Monday, December 26; and New Year's Eve, Friday, December 30.

Leaf pickup alternates between the south and north sides of U.S. 30 on a weekly basis. The week of Thanksgiving - Monday, November 21 through Wednesday, November 23 – is when crews collect leaves on town properties, including the parks, the water towers, etc, said Andrew Hansen, Public Works Director. "We also use this week to catch up as typically this is when accumulation is the heaviest," Hansen said.

After the week of Thanksgiving, the regular schedule resumes north of U.S. 30. Leaf and branch pickups continue into December until weather forecasts indicate the Public Works trucks must be readied for snow removal and icv conditions. To ensure your leaves are picked up, please place them in a narrow pile (away from the branches) in the parkway or grassy area between the sidewalk and the curb by 7 a.m. on the Monday morning of your designated week. Please avoid parking any vehicles in front of the leaf piles.

To avoid an ordinance violation and to prevent flooding caused by blockage of storm drains, please don't put leaves in the street. If there is no curb, please place leaves within 5 feet of the street so that Public Works equipment can reach them. And always make certain the leaves are free of other debris.

Remembering...

On Sunday, September 11, people of all ages gathered at Schererville's 9-11 Memorial to remember and honor those who died, those who served and those who carry on 21 years after the tragedy that united our nation.


"The silent open ceremony from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. that day provided an opportunity for people to spend time at the 9-11 Memorial and to walk around the memorial that has grown since the first beam was erected in 2013. The purpose of the ceremony and the memorial is 'to never forget'," said Schererville Police Chief Peter Sormaz.

A concrete handicap-accessible sidewalk was constructed around the 9-11 Memorial this past summer to allow visitors to view the memorial from all sides, Chief Sormaz said. In addition, an irrigation system was installed to keep the grass and shrubbery around the memorial well watered, he said.

The 9-11 Memorial's location at the corner of Junction Street and Joliet Street near the Pennsy Greenway Trailhead provides easy access for those who wish to visit the memorial.

Maintaining the 9-11 Memorial takes a community effort. Donations to the Schererville 9-11 Memorial help continue its mission of remembrance. Donations of cash or checks can be dropped off at the Schererville Police Department, 25 East Joliet Street.

"Please include a notation that the funds are for the '9-11 Memorial'," Chief Sormaz said.

Call 811 Before You Dig!

Whether you're planning to plant a tree, put in a new fence or create a garden in your yard, it's vital that at least two days before you dig that you call 811 or visit <u>indiana811.org</u>. That's because utilities including gas lines, electrical lines and water mains are located underground, some just inches below the surface.

This national call-before you-dig phone number will help keep service to you and your neighbors from being disrupted, and help protect you from expensive repair costs and a potential fine. More importantly, this can help protect you from a serious or even fatal injury. Making this brief phone call or web visit is important no matter how shallow you dig or how simple your project is, since different utility lines are buried at different depths.

When you call 811 or visit <u>indiana811.org</u> utility crews will come to your property and mark the approximate location of underground utility lines *at no cost to you*. Those buried utilities will be marked with water-based marking paint or flags.

Utilities are marked with different colors

- Red Electric power lines, cables, conduit and lighting cables
- Orange Telecommunication, alarm or signal lines, cables or conduit
- Yellow Natural gas, oil, steam, petroleum or other flammable material
- Green Sewers and drain lines
- Blue Potable drinking water

Even if you're planning to dig in a spot that was previously marked, it's important to call 811 or visit indiana811.org. That's because erosion and root system growth can alter the depth or location of buried lines. Or your utility companies may have completed work on their lines since the last time you dug.

If you've hired a contractor of landscaper to do your digging project, be sure to check that the contractor or landscaper contacts 811 a few business days before digging begins.

Remember: The service is free. The law requires it. It may save you money. And it may save your life!
