Schererville Crossroads **PROTECTING OUR WATER QUALITY**

Mandated by the Federal Environmental Six steps to protecting water quality: Protection Agency, the Town of Schererville is participating in a program called the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems or MS4. The program is meant to regulate the intake of nonpoint source pollution or storm water runoff into the Town's storm sewers and drainage ditches.

Several commonly used products such as oil, antifreeze, litter, animal wastes, fertilizer, pesticides and sediment from erosion can be washed into the storm drain systems during rain storms or even from melting snow.

The MS4 program includes six techniques designed to reduce these water pollutants. The first two measures are to be expected but perhaps the most critical: public education and, even more importantly, public participation.

- Never dump automotive waste materials or used household products into a storm drain, anywhere on the ground, or into a basement sump pump.
- Make an effort to buy environmentally friendly household products.
- Always follow the instructions carefully when using or discarding household products.
- Be conscious of what lies "downstream" when washing cars or applying lawn care products.
- Avoid long term exposure of uncovered soil stockpiles, establish vegetation to prevent erosion.
- Clean up pet waste and dispose of it in a method that will prevent introduction into storm sewers or ditches.

Spring Cleaning Time

dirt that has settled now that the snow is gone, we look ahead to some spring cleaning. The Schererville Branch and Leaf Collection department will help in that effort. Here is the information for 2015:

- Spring leaf collection for 2015 will begin April 13th. Leaves will be picked up for six weeks (the end of leaf collection being the week of May 18^{th)}. This does not include the Briar Ridge subdivision.
- Branch collection begins March 30th on the north side of U.S. 30, and continues through the year until it starts snowing, usually occurring in mid-December.
- Each week the route alternates between north and south with U.S. 30 as the dividing line.

Branch and Leaf Pick-up Policies

- To be assured your piles of branches/leaves are picked up, have it in front of your residence by 7:00 a.m on Monday morning of your designated week for pick-up.
- Branches and leaves are to be placed in the parkway between the sidewalk and the street, at least five feet from the street itself.
- Please do not place branches and leaves in the street.

- As we wash away the winter blues, and the Branches and leaves must be placed in separate piles or they will not be picked up.
 - Residents that have frontage on two roads (houses that face a low volume subdivision street and back up to a main thoroughfare such as 77th Ave.) are required to place leaves and branches on the low volume subdivision
 - Avoid placing leaves and branches in ditches and drainage swales.
 - Do not place leaves in any type of containers.
 - Leaf and branch piles will only be picked up from residents that receive trash service from the Town of Schererville.
 - Large branch piles (4 cubic yards and larger) are more effectively picked-up using a pay loader and dump truck. The route will make every attempt to note the addresses where large piles are located to schedule separate pick-ups on a Friday.
 - Residents are welcome to bring branches/leaves to the municipal dump, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. until 3 p.m. Grass Clippings Disposal Policies & Procedures

• The Public Works Department encourages all residents to use a mulching type lawn mower to recycle grass clippings back into the soil from which they came. continued on back page
