Paying your utility bills can be easier when you go paperless. As of December 2018, more than 3,000 customers used autowithdrawal from a checking account to pay their water bills – almost 25 percent of our regular monthly customers. 
New Town Hall hours

New Director of Operations a familiar face

Schererville continues to grow with new subdivisions and businesses. To help direct that growth, the Town Council recently promoted Jim Gorman, a 25-year employee of the town's Wastewater Department, as Director of Operations.

"There was a Director of Operations position 12 years ago, but then due to budgetary restraints, the

position was eliminated," said Gorman, who has served as Superintendent of the Wastewater Treatment Plant since 2008.

"A lot has been happening in town in recent years, and I will be helping Town Manager Bob Volkmann to continue to do things quickly and efficiently in the administration and building and planning departments," said the 53-year old who now has an office at Town Hall. "I am shadowing Bob, learning all about the administrative aspects of the town."

His experience with multiple construction projects during his time at the Wastewater Treatment Plant will "help with this next adventure," Gorman said, adding that he started with the wastewater treatment plant as a second-shift operator in 1993. Rising through the ranks, he served as Chief of Operations for 10 years before being promoted to the Superintendent's position.

Among the estimated \$25 million in projects at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, Gorman oversaw four projects that included upgrading the main sewage pump station as well as building and



"With all the construction going on in town, we needed to build more tanks," Gorman said. "All of St. John's sewage comes to Schererville, and St. John is also seeing a lot of growth."

Gorman and his wife, Sue, have lived in Schererville for the last 20 years and are the parents of three sons – Alex, 23; Jacob, 20 and Andrew. 16.

Before leaving the Wastewater Treatment Plant Gorman was able to recommend his replacement.

"T.J. Kmiatek started the same day I did in 1993 and has been the Lab Supervisor since 2000. He is now Superintendent," Gorman said. "Erin Barber has now taken over T.J.'s position as Lab Supervisor. She's a longtime employee, too."

Town Hall has been a familiar part of Gorman's tenure with Schererville.

"I attended department head meetings here for the last 10 years," he said. "It's great being here because I know so many of the people already."

Residents, businesses encouraged to sign up for **△**CodeRED[™] alert system

Emergencies require rapid communication, and the Town of Schererville encourages residents and businesses to sign up for the CodeRED Community Mass Notification System.

Launched last fall, CodeRED informs the public of emergencies such as boil water alerts, hazardous traffic conditions, water main leaks, missing child reports and other situations, according to Dan Gin, IT Director. These alerts arrive as calls, text messages and emails. Many residents and businesses are automatically enrolled for emergency notifications.

In addition, the CodeRED system can provide general notification alerts about town events such as festivals or Parks Department programs. These alerts also take the form of calls, text messages and/or emails. To ensure that you will receive notifications, or to create an account with your preferred method of notification, visit www.schererville.org/codered and follow the "opt-in" instructions.

CodeRED allows residents to adjust the account settings at any time. If you would like to opt-out of the service, please contact us so we can add you to a Do Not Call List.


"We also give out food certificates for Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas, and we work with the St. John Township Trustee's office to connect people with the help they need," Anderson said.
