St. John Township Trustee & **Community Center provide** much-needed services, programs

St. John Township encompasses the Towns of Schererville, St. John and Dyer as well as unincorporated areas, a small portion of Griffith and Crown Point, notes St. John Township Trustee Cathy Lareau.

Many activities and programs take place at the St. John Township Community Center, located at 1515 W. Lincoln Highway in Schererville. The community center features the trustee's office, meeting rooms, a food pantry, a hall that can accommodate 180 people, a gazebo and deck and an increasing number of social, educational and assistance programs.

"Anyone who lives within the township who is having financial difficulties can seek assistance with such things as rent and utility bills," Lareau said. "Come to our office and fill out an application. No one can be denied an application although we do have state guidelines we must follow."

These services are "not just a band-aid. We help with financing, build on basic needs and provide guidance," she said. "My job is making sure people's necessities are met."

Lareau works with other organizations to help township residents receive assistance. Those organizations include the Schererville Civic Fund, the Lake County Community Services and the Northwest Indiana Community Action agency.

"We also have a food pantry and all the items are donated by residents, businesses and a wide host of organizations throughout the community," she said.

One of the programs Lareau started for the Township's clients is a clothing and household goods shopping spree at the St. John Township Community Center.

"The township residents are very generous. They bring in clothing and household items, and we host a free shopping spree," Lareau explained.

"We also work with schools to help families whose children qualify for free lunches," she said. "School supplies for those students are also available here at the start of the school year."

Another partnership, with Ivy Tech Community College, promotes occupations in the trades.

"Interested people can obtain certificates for trade positions and get help with tuition through Ivy Tech and the township," Lareau said.

And on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, GED or General Education Development classes are held at the St. John Community Center for those adults who are working toward their high school diplomas. The GED credential can be used to pursue a college education or career advancement.

In an unincorporated area of St. John, there's a park that is currently vacant as well as a cemetery acquired from a private donation that is maintained through Township funds, Lareau said, adding, "We have pauper graves at the cemetery and can help with funeral expenses."

St. John Township also provides fire services for unincorporated areas of the township, Lareau said. "We contract with other fire departments."

The St. John Township Trustee's Office is open from 8 a.m. to noon and from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. To contact the trustee's office, call (219) 865-2705.

Activities abound at Community Center

Social and nutritional programs take place regularly at the Community Center.

For example, senior citizens who are 60 years of age and older meet daily and receive Meals on Wheels from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday through Friday, in partnership with Lake County Community Services.

"There's a hot lunch every day that costs \$2.25 per day. The participants play cards, BINGO, pinochle and board games," Lareau said. "This is a great opportunity for them to socialize."

Transportation is also provided by the St. John Trustee's office, she said.


"Other times of the week, there are other senior groups and community groups that meet here," Lareau said. "Every month we have United For Families Network meeting here." This is a new initiative of the Lake Area United Way that's focused on bringing together non-profits, faith-based organizations and service providers that share a common mission of supporting struggling working families in Lake County, according to the Lake Area United Way website.

The St. John Township Community Center hall which has a 180-person capacity "can be rented by the hour or they can have a banquet. It can be rented for special events such as birthday parties, baby showers, wedding showers and wedding receptions, with packages available" Lareau said.

Those booking the hall for baby or wedding showers or birthday parties can bring their own food.

"For weddings, we have Lencioni Catering from Lynwood providing the menu. There's a bar package available also," she said. "We have also had weddings at our gazebo and the deck provides a wonderful extension for parties."

Lareau said the many opportunities to provide services and special activities for the community "is very rewarding."
