Schererville studying utility rates

Schererville officials are currently in the midst of conducting a utility rate study that will likely indicate Schererville's rates will probably be going up.

"The last time the water and sewer utility rates were studied was in the mid-1980's." said Town Manager Robert Volkmann, "The last time we raised the sewer rates was in the mid-1990's. We are due for some increase."

Schererville operates its own water distribution system purchasing Lake Michigan water wholesale from Indiana-American Water. There

have been increases in our water rates due to increases in our water supply rates from Indiana American; the last Schererville water rate increase was in 1999 or 2000.

The Schererville WasteWater Treatment Plant at 550 Kaeser Boulevard serves the wastewater needs of a population base of approximately 60,000 people in the communities of Schererville. St. John and unincorporated Lake County

Help promote good storm water quality, prevent harmful discharges


Our Town has many buildings and pavement surfaces which don't allow rain and snowmelt to soak into the ground. We rely on storm drains to carry large amounts of runoff from roofs and paved areas to nearby waterways. Unfortunately storm water runoff also carries pollutants such as oil, dirt, chemicals, and lawn fertilizers directly to streams and rivers where that pollution seriously harms water quality, according to the U.S. **Environmental Protection Agency.**

Schererville residents can help promote good storm water quality and prevent harmful discharges into our local streams, ditches, downstream rivers, and waterways a number of ways. For example, don't dump lawn clippings into streams or ditches; either compost or recycle them. Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep driveways, sidewalks, and roads instead of using a hose. Households can also prevent polluted runoff by picking up after pets and using, storing, and disposing of chemicals properly. Check your vehicles for leaks. Contact the Schererville Public Works Department at Publicworks@schererville.org with any questions about storm water maintenance.

Lake County residents can also dispose of household hazardous wastes thanks to the Lake County Solid Waste Management District. Latex paint is among the hazardous wastes processed for disposal at these collections or during regular trash pick-up. The proper disposal of latex paint includes the following steps, according to the LCSWMD:

- 1. Remove lid and add an equal amount of any of the following: cat-litter, sawdust, oil-dry granules, sand, or paint drying crystals, to an equal amount of latex paint.
- 2. Stir contents until the paint and absorbent material-mixture has a thick, oatmeal-like consistency.
- 3. Leave lid off, and allow mixture to air-dry (one to two days) until dry and solid.
- 4. Place at curb for regular trash pick-up, without lid on paint can. Haulers will take the paint if they can see that it is dried out.

Oil based paint can be dried out in the same manner. However, even if it has been dried out, it's still considered hazardous waste and must be taken to a hazardous-waste site. RAVE Alert, Smart911 system now in effect

Schererville fully transitioned to Smart911 and RAVE Mobile alerts in March, replacing the CodeRED emergency alert system. Residents wanting to receive notifications from the Town in the future must sign up for a new, free Smart911 account. Doing so allows them to opt-in to receiving alerts from the Town via RAVE in emails, text messages or voice messages on their cell phones.

Opting in to receive alerts via RAVE can include information about severe weather, road closures, water boil advisories, and other important alerts. This system can also notify residents about local emergencies and directions on how to respond.

"We want to reassure residents that if you do not want to sign up for this service, it won't affect their ability to dial 9-1-1 in case of an emergency," said Dan Gin, Schererville IT Director. "All 9-1-1 calls will be handled as in the past."

However, Gin said, signing up for a Smart911 account allows residents to create a Safety Profile that dispatchers will be able to view when called.

"This can save valuable time in an emergency," he said. "Residents can give as much or as little information as they want. That information first responders will know in case of an emergency could include allergies, medications taken, medical conditions, pets, emergency contacts, and more."



Interested residents must create a new account with Smart911 because information from CodeRed accounts (including user ID's and passwords) do not carry over to the new system. To sign up go to https://www.schererville.org/smart911 and click the green "Sign Up Now" button on the page.


You can make a difference during National Prescription Drug Take Back Day

Too often, unused prescription drugs find their way into the wrong hands – a result that's dangerous and often tragic. According to the 2018 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 9.9 million Americans misused controlled prescription drugs. And the majority of those abused drugs were obtained from family and friends, often from the home medicine cabinet.

On Saturday April 24, you can help make a difference by participating in the National Prescription Take Back Day at the Schererville Police Department, 25 East Joliet Street, said Police Chief Peter Sormaz. The hours are 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Simply clean out your medicine cabinet and turn in those prescription drugs safely and anonymously in the drop off box located in the police station lobby, Chief Sormaz noted.

"The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of medications," according to the Drug Enforcement Administration's website, https://www.deadiversion.usdoj.gov/drug_disposal/takeback/index.html.
