"We don't want a retail center," Town Manager Bob Volkmann said as the Town is moving ahead with plans to transform the old Illiana Motor Speedway along U.S. 30 into a business park.

Schererville is teaming up with the Lake County Economic Alliance (LCEA) to prepare and publish a request for proposals to redevelop the property, said Volkmann. The Schererville Town Council voted unanimously to proceed with this plan on July 14.

"Speaking with Karen Lauerman and Don Kolibowski of the LCEA, they report that they constantly field calls about interest in Northwest Indiana. Illiana is a perfect location to promote economic development for Schererville's future. We're going to go in that direction and are willing to work with developers interested in economic opportunities in the town. Our goal is to have a Business Park that accommodates professional corporate offices, medical offices and light manufacturing type businesses," Volkmann said.


Teaming up with the LCEA on the requests for proposals will allow developers to present their vision for the site and how the town and developer can work together to facilitate the business park.

"We are not considering this area for retail development. The Town's vision is to foster a professional development that includes green space and complements the surrounding areas," Volkmann said.

"Our planned timeline to receive proposals is sometime in September. We'll have to verify that the LCEA feels that this is feasible," Volkmann said.

Volkmann said redeveloping this site will require extensive work including installing streets, a drainage system, storm and sanitary sewers and other infrastructure.

"This site is strategically located along U.S. 30 in Schererville," he said. "There's convenient access to I-65, U.S. 41, IL 394 and to I-80/94. It's a great location."

### Eagle Scout project honors those who served in U.S. Military

Area residents have begun bringing photos of loved ones who served in the U.S. military to Schererville Town Hall to display on the Military Wall of Honor, the newly-completed Eagle Scout project created by 17-year old Mark Metz.

"I am thankful for the men and women who have served our country. I would like to honor them," said Metz about his Eagle Scout project. This project also

allows him to thank town officials and leaders of Scout Troop #532 for their support and encouragement, he said.

"This project was suggested to me by one of my Scout leaders and mentor, Bob Jurgeto," said Metz, a St. John resident who will begin his senior year at Lake Central High School on Aug. 10. "I want to thank him for being my coach and helping me along with this project. I also want to thank Scout Leader Todd Schmidt."

Encouragement also came from Town Manager Robert Volkmann. "I wanted to do this because Mr. Volkmann was very passionate about getting it done," Metz said.



"I am very proud of Mark's accomplishment," Volkmann said. "We hope more residents will continue to bring in photos of those who have served in any branch of the U.S. military from any time period. This is a wonderful way to honor them and to thank Mark for all his hard work and dedication."

To create the Military Wall of Honor, Metz built three 4-foot by 5-foot frames from wood and

filled them with cork. Next he fastened the three boards to a wall at Schererville Town Hall. Finally, a "Hometown Heroes" sign flanked by patriotic stars was placed above the boards.

Ideally the photos brought in to Schererville Town Hall for display will be 5x7 inch photos or smaller, Metz said. Those photos will be attached to the Military Wall of Honor with thumbtacks or staples.

Metz, who began as a Cub Scout, said, "It would mean a lot for me to have this big of an achievement, to reach the rank of Eagle Scout. It's a great honor and accomplishment that will help me in the future."

That future definitely includes going to college "possibly Purdue," he said. "I am still deciding on a major."

### NIPSCO donates \$10K to Schererville Civic Funds

A recent \$10,000 donation by NIPSCO to the Schererville Civic Funds "is a God-send because donations that large are rare. It will have a lasting effect," said Thomas Anderson, President of the Schererville Civic Funds all-volunteer board.

Rick Calinski, Director of Public Affairs and Economic Development for NIPSCO, presented the check to members of the Schererville Civic Funds board during the June 9 Schererville Town Council meeting. In addition to Anderson, Schererville Civic Funds members present at that meeting included Hal Slager, Civic Funds Treasurer, and Ed Fesenmyer, a long-time board member.

"Rick is a Schererville resident, and he wants to help in the town," Anderson said.

A brochure about the mission of the Schererville Civic Funds always goes out in the water bill in December, Anderson noted, which helped acquaint Calinski with how the organization helps Schererville residents.

"The Schererville Civic Funds has been around for 65 years. We help our Schererville residents with food certificates at the holidays. We also help with NIPSCO bills, water bills and rent," Anderson said.

"We have a storehouse of medical equipment that is supplied for free to those in need, and we provide educational grants for Schererville high school seniors who need help with college tuition," he said.

Donations of any amount are appreciated, Anderson said. "Ninety-five percent of every dollar goes directly to Schererville residents in need," he added.

# Lake Hills Fire Dept. now provides Advanced Life Support to St. John Township residents

Thanks to funding approved on March 30 by the St. John Township Board, the Lake Hills Fire Department, located at 9105 W. 85th Ave. in Schererville, now provides Advanced Life Support emergency services to residents of St. John Township.

"St. John Township residents will now have the same care as the surrounding communities," said Lake Hills Fire Chief Shane Adams about the change from Basic Life Support.

"We are very excited and happy to be able to provide this service to our residents," Chief Adams said. "This has been possible due to the overwhelming support by the St. John Township Trustee Cathy J. Lareau and Munster Community Hospital."

The Lake Hills Fire Department started ambulance service in 1993 with the ambulance staffed by all-volunteer firefighters/ Emergency Medical Technicians, he said. Then in 2013 the Fire Department started staffing the ambulance with two EMT's on Mondays through Fridays during the day.



"We have slowly been adding on shifts and hours throughout the years, and we have been working on funding so we could provide Advanced Life Support," Chief Adams said. "Until this transition, the Lake Hills Fire Department has had to rely on the surrounding fire departments for Advanced Life Support. The surrounding fire departments have done an outstanding job helping us in this capacity, and we would like to thank them for this."

St. John Township Trustee Cathy J. Lareau said when she was elected to the township leadership office in 2019 she and Chief Adams "discussed the need for the fire department to provide



Advanced Life Support emergency services to the residents of St. John Township. This required additional funding from the Trustee's office."

Lareau said she met with accountants who specialize in municipalities' budgeting to explore how to provide this additional funding.

"Based on their recommendations, I was able to work within the current tax rate to allocate additional funding to the 2020 budget. The St. John Township Board supported that budget appropriation," Lareau said.

"In 2020 with this additional funding, Lake Hills Fire Department moved to staffing the fire department 24/7," she said. "This resulted in quicker response times in getting to the aid of those in need."

Preparing the budget for the calendar year 2021, Lareau said she again worked with the current tax rate to provide additional funding for the Lake Hills fire services.

"The Township Board completely supported the budget," she said. "I am honored to have been able to work with the St. John Township Board Members Mike Aurelio, Lisa Elders and Dan Bielski, and Chief Adams on this huge accomplishment."

Chief Adams also thanked the St. John Township Board, and Dr. Jonathan Garoza, EMS Medical Director, and Thomas Bettenhausen, EMS Coordinator, of Munster Community Hospital "for the hard work and commitment to make this happen."

### Dyer-Schererville Library now offering in-person services, activities

Since May 2020, when the COVID-19 pandemic shut down so many in-person activities, the Lake County Public Library has gradually resumed those in-person services and activities as dictated by guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control.

n August nearly all materials and services will again be available at the Dyer-Schererville Branch Library, 1001 W. Lincoln Hwy (U.S. 30), Schererville, said Chris Rettig, Branch Manager.

That will include 16 public Web computers with up to six hours of use per person per day. Four quiet study rooms now provide a place for groups of one to four people to meet for up to two hours. Tables and chairs are also back in the library, just waiting to be used, Rettig said.

The library has provided online ZOOM events throughout the pandemic," she said. "But now our staff has had the opportunity to be fully vaccinated, so we will start offering more indoor, inperson programming in August and September."

Rettig encourages Schererville residents to visit www.lcplin.org to view and register for all upcoming programs.

Due to staff shortages throughout the Lake County library system, hours that the Dyer-Schererville Branch is open are still limited, Rettig noted.

Those hours are as follows:

- From 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday
- From 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.

"Before and after hours, call (219) 322-4731, ext. 4, to leave a voicemail message with your question or request, and librarians will return calls as soon as possible," Rettig said.

"Even though the library is open for walk-ins, curbside delivery remains the safest option to pick up books and DVDs that have been reserved online or over the phone using your library card," she added.

# Celebrate Schererville Festival 'a huge success'

The Celebrate Schererville Festival at Redar Park was definitely the place to be June 9 through June 13.

"We estimated about 50,000 were in attendance over that five days! It was a huge success," said Josh Barnes, Recreation Coordinator with the Schererville Parks & Recreation Department, about the town's first major festival since the COVID-19 pandemic shut down so much across the nation.

"A new amusement company – Modern Midways – provided all new rides this year," Barnes said. And for the first time ever, Schererville Parks introduced the MEGAPASS wristband, which allowed festival-goers unlimited rides for the pre-sale price of \$50.

Festival-goers, ages 21 and older, also enjoyed a bigger beer garden this year, operated by Firefighters Local 4279. In addition, BINGO games sponsored by The Knights of Columbus Council 12177 were



a hit at the festival. And foodies of all ages nibbled and noshed on goodies provided by a variety of vendors.

When it came to music, the Celebrate Schererville Festival offered a wide range of bands and soloists appearing on stage including Vintage Postcard, Chronic Flannel, PRX 5, Dick Diamond, Saturday June Band, Mr. Funnyman, Nate Venturelli, Echoes of Pompeii, Salted Coffee Band, and Nicole Jamrose.

"This was definitely the way to celebrate our town and bring people back together," Barnes said.
